The ONA's mandate is to advance, assert, support and preserve Okanagan Nation sovereignty. Further, the ONA is charged with providing members with a forum to discuss and form positions on areas of common concern.

The ONA is seeking to employ a skilled and experienced individual to work as a Fisheries Biologist 2. The Biologist will undertake duties within the Okanagan basin, with project and work sites primarily in the Penticton and Oliver areas. The successful applicant should be comfortable working in a fast-paced and dynamic environment, supervise field crews, be able to work independently and have excellent communication skills.

Key Duties and Responsibilities:

- Coordinate and implement fisheries projects which will include:
 - stream water quality sampling, stream water level logging and analysis
 - salmon enumerations by snorkel and biological sampling, invertebrate sampling
 - fish habitat measurements, project public outreach
 - analysis and interpret monitoring data
- Supervision and training of field crews, monitoring data and assess fish and aquatic issues in the Okanagan Basin
- Identify and assist in development of potential fisheries proposals and projects, technical data entry in Microsoft Excel and Access programs
- Preparation and review of scientific technical reports
- Other duties as required

ONA employs fisheries technicians throughout the year with peak activities between September through November. The ONA is currently seeking to employ On-Call Fisheries Technicians. The work term will be approximately between September to end of October (possible extension into November), with up to 40 hours per week, but will vary with field schedules. As a Technician you will undertake duties associated with the Okanagan Nation Alliance's Sockeye broodstock collection, and field monitoring program in the South Okanagan. The successful applicants should be comfortable working in and near streams, under potentially inclement fall weather. Since most projects are time-sensitive it is critical that the applicant is committed and dedicated to on-the-job responsibilities.

Duties may include:

- Fish capture through beach seining in the Okanagan River
- Collecting salmon carcasses while wading
- Other duties as required of projects.

Qualifications:

- Work experience in fisheries related field work is preferred
- Knowledge of fish identification an asset.
- Valid class 5 BC driver's license, swift water training, experience handling small boats an asset.

The Wildlife Biologist 2 will undertake duties associated with ONA initiatives with a specific focus on wildlife, hunting and natural resources. The job incumbent will be located in Penticton and will be responsible for the active participation and coordination of a variety of wildlife and natural resource projects and programming within ONA territory, specifically within the upper Columbia and Kootenay regions. The successful applicant should be comfortable working in a fast-paced and dynamic environment, supervise field crews, be able to work independently and have excellent communication skills.

Key Duties and Responsibilities:

- Design, plan and manage several projects, supervise field crews, work independently most of the time, and demonstrate excellent communication skills.
- Provide scientific information and advice, recommend strategies, standards and methodologies in support of healthy, productive and sustainable wildlife habitat and wildlife populations.
- Coordinate and implement natural resource projects which will include working with consultants, government agencies, member bands and ONA departments
- Perform administrative and other critical tasks attached to the position which include, inputting, maintaining and summarizing data and relevant information in databases and provide data as required, budgeting, and quality control
- Perform standard methods and protocols associated with field/laboratory analysis of physical parameters and the operation of manual or automated analytical instrumentation
